

## INSTITUT PAUL BOCUSE GRANT POLICY

### 1<sup>st</sup> year admitted students in Bachelor's degree

With the generous support of the G&G Péliisson Foundation for the Institut Paul Bocuse, all students of the Institut may access a grant under certain conditions.

#### **GRANT POLICY**

The aim of the Institut Paul Bocuse is to make its training accessible to a larger number of students. This grant policy was initiated under the auspices of the G&G Péliisson Foundation.

**The grant program is reserved for 1<sup>st</sup> year admitted students in Bachelor's degree.** Students who have been awarded a grant in their first year may apply again under certain conditions.

There are two types of grants:

#### 1 - **MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS**

This is a scholarship for students under the age of 28 and awarded to deserving students who can demonstrate excellent academic results before joining the Institut Paul Bocuse.

2 scholarships are awarded per year and per cursus, or 6 scholarships in total.

#### Criteria for the selection of applicants:

"VERY GOOD" rating for the high school diploma and/or an average of 16/20 during the final year or a BTS or an equivalent diploma (including foreign ratings).

#### Assistance granted:

A percentage set by the Grants Committee of up to 50% of tuition fees. Other costs will remain the responsibility of the student.

Period of validity:

Annual grant.

The scholarship is renewable the following year according to the following criteria:

- The student has an average mark of 15/20 and/or is one of the top 3 students in the class.
- Attendance certificate (showing 0 hrs of absence not justified by the teaching block)
- Involvement in the life of the school.

## 2- **GRANT BASED ON SOCIAL CRITERIA**

These grants are for students under the age of 28, whose family resources are limited. They are defined according to the scales of the CROUS.

A maximum of 15 grants based on social criteria are awarded, or 5 grants per cursus.

Assistance granted:

A percentage set by the Grants Committee, corresponding to the CROUS grants, and up to 100% of tuition fees. Other costs will remain the responsibility of the student.

Period of validity:

Annual grant

The grant is renewable the following year according to the following criteria:

- The student has an average of 15/20 and/or is one of the top 3 students in the class.
- Attendance certificate (showing 0 hrs of absence not justified by the teaching block).

## **GRANTS COMMITTEE**

The Grants Committee is composed of:

- the General Delegate of the G & G Pélisson Foundation for the Institut Paul Bocuse.
- the Director General of the Institut Paul Bocuse Teaching Group
- the Academic Director, Graduate Cursus

## **PROCEDURES**

In order to apply for a grant, the student must first apply for admission to the Institut Paul Bocuse. As soon as the student's application for admission is approved by the Admissions Committee of the Institut Paul Bocuse, the Grants Committee will review the student's grant application and decide whether to accept or reject it based on the information provided.

### **1- Grant application dates:**

A duly completed application must be submitted when the student registers:

- at the latest March 15 for the academic year starting in September
- at the latest November 15 for the beginning of the calendar year

Since the Institut Paul Bocuse receives more applications than its resources, it is very important to provide all the documents requested.

The Committee will not review any application received after the deadline and/or incomplete files.

### **2- The Grants Committee meeting dates:**

The Grants Committee meets two times a year to validate grants:

- at the latest April 10 for the academic year starting in September
- at the latest December 10 for the beginning of the calendar year

## **COMMITMENTS OF STUDENTS WHO RECEIVE GRANTS**

Students who receive grants are required to participate in a number of events as well as outreach and promotion operations of the Institut and its Foundation.

Students who receive grants are required to show exemplary academic, professional and personal behavior. Inappropriate attitudes or behavior in and out of the Campus may result in immediate suspension of the grant.

The Grants Committee reserves the right to request a partial or total refund of the grant, in the event of non-exemplary conduct leading to disciplinary sanctions.

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
